The year 2015 is almost history. It was challenging and rewarding. If not for the many dedicated volunteers, financial donors, pet lovers, and individuals who care for homeless dogs and cats, our organization and the Friends of Gallia County's Animals would cease to exist. But we are committed to improving the lives of domestic animals and by working together we have succeeded and we will continue as long as we have the means to do so.

The veterinarians and staff of French Town Veterinary Clinic and Riverbend Animal Clinic exceed our expectations. They spayed or neutered more than 350 cats and 40 dogs this year. Three reasons for the big difference in the number of dogs and cats "fixed" are:

- 1. There are more cats than dogs because a female cat can get pregnant when $4\frac{1}{2}$ months old, get pregnant while nursing kittens and have another litter 60 days later, and give birth to three or more litters of kittens in one year.
- 2. There is no cat shelter in Gallia County and the dog pound does not accept cats.
- 3. It is more expensive to have a dog spayed or neutered.

If a stray cat shows up at your house, don't ignore it. Be part of the solution and not the problem. Have it spayed or neutered. We can help.

We realize that spaying and neutering does not get the publicity that pet adoption does. Finding homes for unwanted dogs and cats is very important and we encourage and support pet adoption. We just want to make it easier by improving the odds.

Please consider making a donation so that we can continue our work in Gallia County. Any amount will be appreciated. And remember: "Don't litter. Spay and neuter."
